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

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Carol Jarvis and team publish in journal

Endocrinology & Research RN, Carol Jarvis with Kim Simcox, Jade Tamatea, Kim McAnulty, Win Meyer-Rochow, John Conaglen and Marianne Elston have published the findings of their study in the April issue of Clinical Endocrinology.

Carol and her fellow researchers investigated the incidence of iodinated contrast-induced thyrotoxicosis to determine whether thyrotoxicosis was more common in patients 70 years and older compared to younger patients following administration of iodinated contrast media.



Patients with underlying thyroid abnormality or elderly patients may be at an increased risk of developing hypo- or hyperthyroidism following routine administration of iodinated contrast media used in CT investigations.

The authors, Leanne Bolton and Tanya Loveard, a Registered Nurse and Occupational Therapist, work at the Mary Potter Hospice in Wellington. Bolton and Loveard, recognising that caring for patients with dementia or delirium was a challenge for the unit staff, developed a toolkit to improve care for these patients.

"The initiative has noticeably changed the culture within the inpatient unit interdisciplinary team in regards to caring for a patient with dementia and delirium."

The name Te Kete Marie, the peaceful basket, reflects the concept of empowering both a confused patient and the interdisciplinary team, with a peaceful approach to the provision of care.

Publishing tips — time, space & energy

A staff member who is publishing her first book shares some tips to encourage fledgling writers to give it a go.

Time, space and energy are critical elements of a successful writing venture. Time set aside to work on the book, space to be able to lay out your work, and the energy to grapple with the task. "It's okay to spend six months preparing before launching into writing"



Be wary of distractions that can draw the writers attention too easily Distractions lead to a loss of focus often leading to weeks of wasted time before the writer can get back on track.

In the early stages spend some time on preparation. Background reading on the subject helps the writer to clarify and consolidate their own ideas. Write these ideas on a whiteboard to help organise thoughts.


