One day Intensive Masterclass for Health Professionals and Community Workers

This one day workshop gives an overview of grief theory and the practices around working with people facing the end of life. It draws on international research and explores the challenges of working with people and their extended family/whānau.



It is enriched through personal stories of grief from individual community members and through small group discussion and interaction.

The course is targeted at health professionals and/or community and social care workers. It is presented by Mary Potter staff including specialists in bereavement, spiritual care, Māori and Pacific approaches
